ASSESSMENTS& SURVEYS

Each year, students in grades three through eight and high school participate in the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) testing.

Opportunities for students who take the CAASPP and achieve a Met or Exceeded score on the ELA/Math or Science sections can include. but are not limited to, qualifying for the State Seal of Biliteracy for students taking a World Language and The Golden State Seal of Merit Diploma. In addition, the California State University System and participating California Community Colleges accept the CAASPP test for college-level written communication/English or Math courses without additional testing. The CAASPP test is also part of the reclassification for English Language Learners.

STUDENT ACADEMIC ASSESSMENTS

ASSESSMENTS

For the 2023-24 school year, your student will take the following test(s), depending on their grade level:

- California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) in English Language Arts/Literacy and Mathematics in grades three through eight, and grade eleven
- California Science Test (CAST) in grades five, eight and once in high school

The **CAASPP** assessments are online tests that measure what your child knows and is able to do. The tests include many different types of questions that allow students to interact with the test questions. Results help identify gaps in knowledge or skills early on so your child can get the support he or she needs to be successful in school.

STUDENT SURVEYS

Each year, students in grades 4-12 participate in information gathering used to help promote better health and wellness among our students and to improve the school learning environment, as well as identify needs for additional student services.

The following surveys are conducted in the corresponding grades:

- CA Healthy Kids Survey Grades, 5, 7, 9 & 11

ATHLETICS

LVJUSD is proud to offer a wide variety of athletic opportunities for grades 6-12. Opportunities will vary from middle to high school, and sometimes from school to school.

ATHLETIC REQUIREMENTS

To participate in school sports there are certain requirements that MUST be met **prior to trying out and participating in the activity**. They include:

Academic Requirement:

All students who wish to participate in school athletics must meet the academic requirement of **having and maintaining** a 2.0 minimum grade point average (GPA).

Physical Clearance:

Prior to trying out or participating in any sport, students must have the District Sports Physical

Physician Form completed by their physician and submitted to their school. Physical forms are valid for one (1) year from the date of the physician's signature.

ATTENDANCE

The mission of the Livermore Valley Joint Unified School District (LVJUSD) is that each student will graduate with the skills needed to contribute and thrive in a changing world.

To accomplish this mission, students must attend school daily and fully participate in the District's educational program. Therefore, the District will support and enforce California Education compulsory education laws. There is a very strong connection between student attendance and student performance in school. Research shows that students who attend school every day pass state tests in reading and math at much higher rates than students who attend school less than 85% of the time. Higher attendance equals higher achievement for all students.

EXCUSED VS. UNEXCUSED ABSENCES

EXCUSED ABSENCE:

School attendance is required by state law. The California Education Code section 48200 requires that every child 6 to 18 years old must attend school every day and on time unless there is an acceptable reason for the absence. Acceptable reasons for excused absences include, but are not limited to, illness, medical appointments, and attendance at immediate family funeral services. Doctor notes maybe required for some absences.

UNEXCUSED ABSENCE:

An unexcused absence is an absence not excused by Education Code 48200 and 48260. Absences due to activities such as babysitting, accompanying parents on errands, and attending sporting events or concerts are unexcused.

Parents/guardians are responsible for their child's school attendance and must notify the school if their child is not attending school and why.

CHILD WELFARE ASSISTANT (CWA)

What is a CWA?

The Child Welfare Assistant supports students, families and schools in a variety of areas. The Child Welfare and Attendance Specialists (CWA), are outreach workers who are assigned to specific school sites. CWA's promote school enrollment, increasing school attendance, school transfer, and are homeless liaisons for special populations including foster, homeless, and recently immigrated students and families. CWA's also support the District with health and wellness strategies including school adjustment, school attendance, and community and agency resource referrals for social, emotional, and behavioral services. CWA's are considered a resource and partner to all of our educational partners.



BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE

The Livermore Valley Joint **Unified School District** (LVJUSD) is committed to providing an excellent education for our students during the school day, as well as ensuring families have access to high quality and affordable before and after-school care on our elementary, TK-8 and middle school campuses.

Based on where your child goes to school, you may register your child for LARPD's ESS or the Right at School, or the LVJUSD ASES program. Each program provides before and after-school programming in a safe environment right on our LVJUSD campuses.


CALENDARS

CHILD NUTRITION

Our Child Nutrition Services
Department is made up of a
team of food and nutrition
professionals who are dedicated
to students' health, well being,
and their ability to learn. Our
department serves students at
all 18 of our schools sites.

We support learning by promoting healthy habits for lifelong nutrition and fitness practices. Meals, foods, and beverages served at our schools meet state and federal requirements, which are based on the USDA Dietary Guidelines. We offer a variety of healthy breakfast and lunch menus that meet the nutrition needs of our students and energize them for learning.

MONTHLY MEAL MENUS

BREAKFAST AND LUNCH MENUS

LVJUSD provides one no-cost breakfast and lunch daily for all students at every school site through the California Universal Meals Program. Monthly menus are created for all grade levels following Federal and State guidelines to ensure that our students are served healthy, nutritious food. Menus are available online through NutriSlice.

NOTE: All students will be asked to scan their ID card or enter their Student ID number to receive meals, keeping in compliance with the universal meals program.

PURCHASING ADDITIONAL MEALS

Any student can purchase an additional serving of breakfast or lunch at school.

2023-24 COVID-19 PROTOCOLS for students

Our school district follows the COVID-19 guidance from the California Department of Public Health.



To minimize the spread of COVID-19 within our school communities, please follow the CDPH guidance outlined below.

POSITIVE CASE PROTOCOLS

CDPH guidance is primarily focused on protecting those most at risk for serious illness while minimizing the disruptive impact of isolation in schools. With broad immunity from vaccination and/or natural infection and readily available treatments for infected people, CDPH currently recommends the following:

- If you exhibit COVID-19 symptoms and/or test positive, stay home until you have not had a fever for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medication AND other COVID-19 symptoms are mild and improving.
 (Please note: This aligns with our district's general Illness Exclusion Protocols which states any student with a fever must stay at home.)
- 2. **Mask** when you are around other people indoors for the 10 days after you become sick or test positive (if no symptoms). You may remove your mask sooner than 10 days if you have two sequential negative tests at least one day apart. Day 0 is symptom onset date or positive test date.
- 3. **Avoid contact with people at <u>higher-risk</u>** for severe COVID-19 for 10 days. Higher-risk individuals include the elderly, those who live in congregate care facilities, and those who have immunocompromising conditions.
- 4. <u>Seek Treatment.</u> If you have symptoms, particularly if you are at <u>higher risk for severe COVID-19</u>, speak with a healthcare provider as soon as you test positive. You may be eligible for <u>antiviral medicines</u> or other treatments for COVID-19. COVID-19 antiviral medicines work best if taken as soon as possible, and within 5-7 days from when symptoms start.

TEST AVAILABILITY

Our district will continue to provide no-cost COVID tests until our supply is exhausted. Please reach out to your school office staff to request a test kit.

revision and updating process required by the State of
California.

The Parcel Tax Oversight Committee serves the Livermore community by providing assurance that the funds generated by Measure G are being allocated and disbursed in keeping with the intent of the ballot language.



SPECIAL EDUCATION

Special Education Services include early identification and assessment, partial or all-day specialized instruction, and special related services. There are a variety of program options, placement options and related services available to meet the needs of eligible students.

IEP stands for Individualized Education Program. An Individualized Educational Planning (IEP) team determines a student's placement in a special education program.


REQUESTING AN ASSESSMENT

Assessments should be requested at your student's school site via email or delivered in a written/typed letter to the school psychologist. The school psychologist will contact you to determine areas of concern and which areas should be considered during assessment. If assessment is deemed appropriate, an assessment plan will be sent to you for consent. It may take up to 60 days from the receipt of your signature for assessment to be completed, and the assessment team to present its results in an IEP meeting to determine eligibility.

MENTAL HEALTH RESOURCES

LVJUSD MENTAL HEALTH WEBSITE

LVJUSD's Mental Health Website is a vetted resource of information on mental health disorders and protective factors that can help to prevent a decline in the mental health of our students. Whereas risk factors are known contributors to mental illness, protective factors are elements that bolster well-being. Protective factors encapsulate all aspects of being human from taking care of our physical bodies to bonding with others. A list of protective factors can be found on <u>our website</u>.

The Mental Health website also hosts articles, videos, and book recommendations to aid in opening up a dialogue between you and your child.

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORTS

KID CONNECTION

The Kid Connection, a Tier 2 Social Emotional Learning Program, provides social emotional, and behavioral student support at all of our elementary and TK-8 schools. Each school's website has an online portfolio of videos for all students and parents to access when needed. Topics of videos include being aware of your emotions, dealing with anger, dealing with boredom, emotional regulation/self-control, setting goals, and solving problems. Videos are also available on our District website.

ON CAMPUS COUNSELORS

Counselors are staffed at each of our TK-8, middle, and high school campuses, and are being phased in at our elementary school sites. Through our network of local mental health partners, outside-agency staff also provides counseling support. For more information or to make an appointment, contact the counseling office or main office at your school site.

CARE SOLACE

Care Solace is an online resource with a live, 24/7 concierge line that assists individuals in finding local mental health-related programs and counseling services. Access to Care Solace is available to our students, staff, and families at no cost. Care Solace does not require a user's name, address, phone number, or date of birth. All of the information that is entered on their platform is completely confidential and stored securely.

Report Cards, educational assessments, and student surveys are used to establish the level of a student's academic progress as well as their social-emotional success and well-being on our school campuses.

STUDENT REPORT CARDS

There are three grade reporting periods for all grade levels referred to as Trimester 1, Trimester 2, and Trimester 3. For the 2023-24 school year, the start and end dates for each trimester are:

Trimester 1 - August 21 - November 17, 2023

Trimester 2 - November 27, 2023 - March 7, 2024

Trimester 3 - March 11 - June 6, 2024

ELEMENTARY REPORT CARDS

Parents are able to view student reports cards through the Illuminate Parent Portal.

SECONDARY REPORT CARDS

Report cards are emailed home as a download link to the primary parent email on file with the District. The link is active for 7 days. If the link expires, contact your home school office to have another link sent to you.

NOTE: Parents/Guardians are encouraged to stay current with their student's progress by creating a parent account in <u>Schoology</u>, and checking class grades on a regular basis.

TRANSCRIPTS

For a small fee, students may request official or unofficial copies of their transcripts.

- 2023 LVJUSD graduates may contact their home school to order a copy of their transcripts.
- LVJUSD 2022 graduates and earlier may order transcripts through our <u>Student Services Department</u>.

SCHOOL SAFETY

We are committed to providing a safe environment in which students can learn and thrive.

Tip Line is a way of ensuring that all concerns are addressed. Students, families, staff, and community members are encouraged to use Tip Line to report any safety concern to school and/or District administration. Tip Line can also be used to share positive comments.

Tips can be left anonymously or with contact information. Any contact information will be treated with confidentiality.

Personal information will only be shared with staff that is tasked with addressing the tip.

STUDENTS ON CAMPUS BEFORE SCHOOL

For the safety of your student, we recommend that students do not arrive on campus more than 15 minutes before the start of their school day. Please refer to your school's bell schedule for the start time of each day on your campus.

TIP LINE

LVJUSD Tip Line is a real-time communication tool used to report both kudos and concerns around student and school safety. While Tip Line provides notifications to district staff when a report is made, please CALL 9-1-1 if you are witnessing an immediate threat or incident that requires emergency action.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS (SRO)

LVJUSD works closely with the Livermore Police Department to provide support to our high school communities. Livermore and Granada campuses have one SRO on site daily to foster positive relationships with students, and support staff with juvenile crime and safety concerns.

SRO's also attend sporting events and dances as necessary to ensure the safety of our students and staff.





SCHOOLOGY

LVJUSD utilizes Schoology to provide a simple way for students to stay on top of their assignments and grades, and for parents to have easy access to student reports and testing scores.

A login and password is required to access Schoology for both students and parents.

VISITORS & VOLUNTEERS

LVJUSD encourages all those interested in volunteering to read the information on our <u>Visitors</u> and <u>Volunteering</u> website before creating an account in the LVJUSD Raptor Volunteer Portal. After reviewing the website, if you still have questions about the requirements to become a volunteer, please contact your school site administration.





WHO IS A VISITOR?

A visitor is defined as an individual who attends a special event or a singular activity. Visitors must check in at the office and scan their government-issued ID into our Raptor Technology identification scanner. If no identification card is available, a manual entry can be completed with assistance. This will allow for all visitors to be screened through the National Sex Offenders Database (also known as Megan's Law Clearance) each time they visit a campus.

Examples of a visitor include a parent helping with a class project or elementary field day, or attending an assembly, parent conference, or performance during the school day.

WHO IS A VOLUNTEER?

A volunteer is defined as a non-paid individual who, with District authorization, assists students, schools, or educational programs. We have two types of volunteers in our District: General Clearance Volunteers and Extended Clearance Volunteers. All volunteers are required to complete a volunteer application, code of conduct form, and have a clear tuberculosis screen on file. Additional information and documents are required if an extended volunteer clearance is desired.

All volunteer clearances expire annually on June 30 and must be renewed each school year.

General Clearance Volunteers:

These include classroom volunteers and other on-campus school volunteers who are directly supervised at all times by LVJUSD staff.

General Clearance Requirements:

- Completion of the LVJUSD Volunteer Application and acknowledgment of our Code of Conduct in the Raptor online portal.
- Scanning of a government-issued ID via the Raptor system when checking in through the main office at a school site.
- Clearance tuberculosis screen record on file. TB screenings are valid for four years but need to be resubmitted annually via the Raptor portal.

Extended Clearance Volunteers:

The extended clearance applies to program-related volunteers such as assistant club leaders, field trips or overnight chaperones, drivers, and other volunteers who will be interacting with students *without the presence of a LVJUSD staff member*. These volunteers must have school site approval to obtain this level of clearance prior to completion of being cleared to volunteer.

- All General Clearance requirements PLUS:
- LiveScan Fingerprinting (DOJ & FBI)

When transporting students in a personal vehicle:

- **LiveScan Fingerprinting (DOJ & FBI)
- Proof of insurance uploaded to Raptor online portal.
 Minimum requirements include: \$100,00/300,000;
 Property Damage \$50,000; Medical \$5,000
